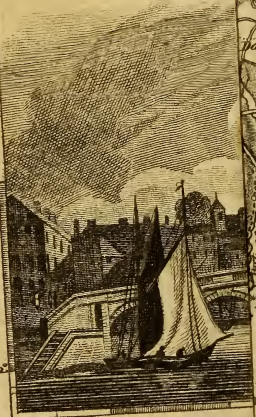

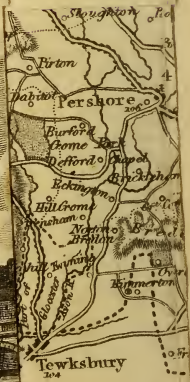

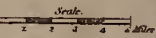

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

City of Worcester.

WORCESTER is a large, populous, handsome City, about four miles in circumference, pleasantly situated in a vale on the bank of the Severn; its general appearance exhibits undoubted proofs of the opulence of its merchants, tradesmen, and inhabitants. The houses are well built, and the streets regular and spacious, with an excellent pavement and convenient footways. It lies $52^{\circ} 9' 30''$ North latitude, and $2^{\circ} 0' 15''$ West longitude from Greenwich, 112 miles from London, and nearly in the centre of the County. It is a City and County of itself, and sends two members to parliament. The number of houses in the year 1811, was 2399, and the population 13611. Since which time a considerable number of houses have been built without the liberties of the City; and if we include the township of St. John's, the Tything of Whitstone, and those parts that are extra-parochial, the total population may now be considered upwards of 15000.

B

The City is governed by a Mayor, Recorder, Six Aldermen (who are Justices of the Peace), chosen out of twenty-four principal citizens, a Sheriff, and Two Chamberlains, annually elected. These are assisted by a Town Clerk, Two Coroners, and Forty-eight Common Council Men, who compose the Corporate Body, and are attended by a Sword Bearer, Four Serjeants at Mace, Thirteen Constables, Four Musicians, and Four Beadles.

The following is an abstract of the Charter granted by King James the First :—

“ The City of Worcester to be a County and City
 “ of itself, distinct from the County of Worcester,
 “ and to be called the County of the City of Worces-
 “ ter.

“ The Judges and Justices to have the power of
 “ holding the Assizes and the Sessions for the County
 “ in the City.

“ The former Bailiffs, Aldermen, Chamberlains,
 “ and Citizens, to be one Body Corporate, by the
 “ name of Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the
 “ City of Worcester.

“ May purchase lands, &c. and may grant and
 “ demise lands, &c.

“ May plead and be impleaded.

“ May have a common Seal, changeable at plea-
 “ sure.

“ One Citizen to be Mayor.

“ Six Citizens to be Aldermen.

“ One Citizen to be Sheriff.

“ Two Citizens to be Chamberlains.

“ Four-and-twenty to be capital Citizens whereof
 “ the Mayor and Six Aldermen are to be Seven.

“ Eight-and-forty other capital Citizens, of which
 “ the Chamberlains are to be two.

“ The Four-and-twenty and the Eight-and forty to
 “ be called Common Council Men.

“ To have a Council House in the Guild Hall, and
 “ to make Bye-Laws.

“ To inflict corporal punishments or fine.

“ To levy fines by distress.

“ The Body at large to choose a Mayor yearly, on
 “ the Monday next after the Feast of St. Barthole-
 “ mew, out of the Twenty-four.

“ If the Mayor die during his office another to be
 “ appointed.

“ The Body at large to choose Six Aldermen yearly
 “ out of the Twenty-four.

“ If any Alderman die in office another to be ap-
 “ pointed.

“ To choose a Sheriff yearly out of the Body at
 “ large.

“ If the Sheriff die during his office another to be
 “ appointed.

“ Two Chamberlains to be elected yearly, out of
 “ the Body at large.

“ If the Chamberlains die during office others to be
 “ appointed.

“ One learned and discreet man to be chosen
 “ Recorder, to continue in office during pleasure.

“ A Common Clerk, four Auditors, and other infe-
 “ rior Officers, to be appointed.

“ Two Coroners to be elected out of the Citizens.
 “ No other Coroner to have power in the City.

“ An Escheater to be elected out of the Citizens,
 “ who is to answer before the Barons of the Exche-
 “ quer.

“ A Sword Bearer to be elected and to continue in
 “ office during pleasure; and to attend the Mayor and
 “ carry the sword before him in the City, and in St.
 “ Michael and St. John's parishes.

“ Four Serjeants at Mace to be elected, and to
 “ continue in office during pleasure and attend the
 “ Mayor and Sheriff.

“ The Body at large to attend the King. The
 “ Mayor to carry the Sword before the King. Four

“ Aldermen to carry the Maces, and at his departure
 “ to attend him to the limits of the County of Wor-
 “ cester.

“ The Body at large to attend any of the Royal
 “ Family. The Mayor and Three of the Aldermen
 “ to carry before them the Maces, and at their depar-
 “ ture to attend them to the limits of the County of
 “ Worcester.

“ If any person elected to any office (except the
 “ Recorder or Common Clerk), shall refuse to act,
 “ to be expelled from all liberties and franchises, or
 “ to be committed to gaol until he will exercise it, or
 “ to be fined or amerced, and may be committed to
 “ gaol until such fines are paid.

“ If any member neglect or refuse to come to
 “ convocation, to be amerced and another chosen.

“ When any of the Twenty-four die or shall absent
 “ themselves from any meeting for twelve months
 “ after summons, they may be removed and other
 “ members chosen into the Twenty-four from the
 “ Forty-eight.

“ When any of the Forty-eight die or be removed,
 “ the residue of the Forty-eight to choose other
 “ Citizens into that number to fill up the vacancies.

“ The Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriff, and Chamber-
 “ lains to take their respective oaths yearly, for the
 “ due execution of their several offices, before ten or
 “ more of the capital Citizens; the Mayor to be sworn
 “ on the MONDAY next after St. Michael's day, or
 “ within fifteen days following; and Aldermen, She-
 “ riff, and Chamberlains, on the second MONDAY
 “ after St. Michael's day, or within fifteen days fol-
 “ lowing.

“ The Recorder, Common Clerk, Auditors, Cor-
 “ ner, and other Officers, to take their several oaths,
 “ for the due execution of their offices, in like
 “ manner.

“ A Court of Record to be holden every Monday,
 “ before the Mayor, Recorder, and Aldermen, or any

“ three or more of them ; the Mayor, or one of the
 “ two ancient Aldermen to be one, of all Pleas, Ac-
 “ tions, Suits, and Trespasses, with force of arms or
 “ otherwise, as well above as under 40s. and of Ac-
 “ tions real as well as personal and mixt.

“ The Mayor, Recorder, and Aldermen of the City
 “ to be Justices, during the time they shall be in
 “ office, for the preservation of the peace, and to chas-
 “ tise and punish offenders, according to the Statutes,
 “ for offences committed within the City.

“ They are also to adjust and rectify abuses in
 “ weights and measures or in selling victuals contrary
 “ to the Statutes and punish all forestallers, regrat-
 “ ters, extortioners, &c. within the City, administer
 “ the oaths to other Justices and to the succeeding
 “ Mayor, for the execution of their respective offices.

“ The Coroners to make returns of Juries, Inquisi-
 “ tions, &c. by them taken, before the Mayor, Recor-
 “ der, and Aldermen.

“ The Sheriff to be attendant upon the Justices of
 “ gaol delivery of the prisoners in the gaol of the
 “ City, and the precepts of the Mayor, Recorder, and
 “ Aldermen, and take his oath for the due execution
 “ of his office, and the office of Escheater, before the
 “ Mayor in the Guild Hall of the City, and not else-
 “ where.

“ The Mayor to return the name of every Sheriff,
 “ under the seal of the City, into Chancery.

“ The Sheriff to keep a court within the City, from
 “ month to month, upon the TUESDAY yearly, and
 “ exercise all powers, jurisdictions, &c. which belong
 “ to the office of a Sheriff.

“ The Sheriff to accompt before the Barons of the
 “ Exchequer, yearly.

“ The Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens to have one
 “ prison or gaol within the City, and the Sheriff to be
 “ the keeper.

“ Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens, have power and

“ authority, to purchase manors, lands, &c. in Mort-
 “ main.

“ A Confirmation granted to the Mayor, Aldermen,
 “ and Citizens, of all and the like liberties, franchises,
 “ rights, jurisdictions, fairs, markets, tolls, customs,
 “ goods, and cattell, of felons and fugitives, goods
 “ and cattells, wayt, estrays, escheats, fines, amerce-
 “ ments, issues, forfeitures, lands, tenements, soils,
 “ commons, void ground, pourprestures, approve-
 “ ments, and all other hereditaments whatsoever,
 “ which the Burgesses of the Town of Worcester, or
 “ the Bailiffs, Aldermen, Chamberlains, and Citizens
 “ of Worcester heretofore held and enjoyed, yielding
 “ to the King such and the like services, rents, and
 “ sums of money, as were heretofore yielded and
 “ paid.

“ The Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens, to enjoy
 “ all gifts, grants, legacies, &c. as the Bailiffs, Alder-
 “ men, and Chamberlains heretofore enjoyed, with
 “ the same power to recover and use the same. And
 “ to enjoy all offices, jurisdictions, powers, and privi-
 “ leges within the City, as was heretofore enjoyed by
 “ them.

“ The Mayor to do and execute all and singular the
 “ things within the City, which the bailiffs heretofore
 “ lawfully did.

“ The Mayor and Aldermen to have, hold, and
 “ enjoy all offices and privileges within the City,
 “ which the Bailiffs and Aldermen heretofore lawfully
 “ held and enjoyed.

“ The Aldermen to hold and enjoy all offices, &c.
 “ which the Aldermen of the City heretofore lawfully
 “ held and enjoyed.

“ The Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Council to
 “ do and execute all things within the City, which the
 “ Bailiffs, Aldermen, Chamberlains, and Council used
 “ to do and execute; and the Chamberlains to do and
 “ execute all things which the Chamberlains within
 “ the City were lawfully wont or ought to do.

“ The Bishop, Dean and Chapter, and their tenants
 “ to enjoy all privileges and customs anciently due to
 “ them.

There are five annual fairs held at Worcester, (*viz.*) on the day before Palm Sunday, on the Saturday in Easter week, on the 15th day of August, on the 19th day of September, and the first Monday in December, and the following markets toll free,—the second Monday in February, and the first Monday in the months of May, June, July, and November.

The Cathedral, notwithstanding the great variety of style it exhibits by having been erected at different periods, has a grand and venerable appearance; its model resembles the Collegiate Church at Brussels, in the Austrian Netherlands.

The general plan is that of a double cross. The tower, which was completed in the year 1374, is 200 feet high, and arises from the great cross aisle; its top is terminated by four pinnacles of open work, and surrounded with battlements. The statues of the Virgin Mary with our Saviour in her arms, and of St. Oswald and St. Wulstan on each side of her are on a level with the windows in the bell room, which contains a set of eight bells, supposed to be equal to those of York, the largest weighing 6600*lb.*

There are nine parish churches within the liberty of the City, and two without (*viz.*);—

1. St. Nicholas, situate on the East side of the Cross, a Rectory in the gift of the Bishop.

2. St. Alban's, situate the North West corner of Fish Street, a Rectory in the gift of the Dean and Chapter.

3. St. Andrews, situate on the North side of Copenhagen Street, a Rectory in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter.

4. St Helen's, situate in the High Street, a Rectory in the gift of the Bishop.

5. St. Swithin's, situate at the West end of Meal-cheapen Street, a Rectory in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter.

6. St. Martin's, situate at the North West angle of the Corn Market, a Rectory in the gift of the Dean and Chapter.

7. All Saints, situate near the bottom of Broad Street, a Rectory in the dispensation of the Crown.

8. St. Clement's, situate near the Bridge, a Rectory in the gift of the Dean and Chapter.

9. St. Peter's, situate near Diglis Meadows, a Vicarage in the presentation of the Dean and Chapter.

10. St John's, situate in the Township of St. John's, a Vicarage in the gift of the Dean and Chapter.

11 St. Michael's, situate the North East corner of the Cathedral, a Rectory in the gift of the Dean and Chapter.

Besides the parochial churches here are the following places of worship for dissenters, (viz.)—

A Chapel in the Connexion of the late Lady Huntingdon, situate in Birdport Street.

Independent Meeting House in Angel Street.

Methodist Chapel in Pump Street.

Anabaptist Meeting House, North West corner of Silver Street.

Quakers Meeting House and burial ground, Sansom Fields.

A Chapel for the use of the Roman Catholics, near Sansom Street.

The principal trade now carried on in Worcester is the manufacture of gloves, in which a very great improvement has taken place within the last few years, and the demand has increased with the spirit and enterprize of the manufacturers. The number of persons employed in the different branches of this manufacture are estimated at about 8000.

There are also three very extensive manufactories

of porcelain, carried on by Messrs. Flight, Barr, and Barr; Messrs. Chamberlains; and Messrs. Thomas Grainger & Co. These gentlemen have by their indefatigable exertions, attained to such a degree of perfection in the whiteness and texture of the ware, and the beautiful paintings now executed, as to rival the first manufactories in Europe.

Worcester is the most considerable hop market in the kingdom, three-fifths of the produce of the surrounding plantations are brought into this City for sale; the average number of pockets sold yearly are upwards of 20,000.

The great fluctuation that takes place in the price of hops, has rendered it an article of great speculation; in proof of which, the early part of the last year the price of hops per cwt. was £24, whereas the last fair, September 19th, the average price was only 72s. The hop market which is situate at the South end of Foregate Street, is governed by Guardians, chosen out of every parish in the City; here are very extensive and commodious warehouses, in which large quantities of hops are lodged for the convenience of the dealers.

The Worcester and Birmingham canal was begun in the year 1791, and was made navigable December 4th, 1815, for which the proprietors obtained an Act of Parliament, and are allowed to take the following sums for tonnage;—On coal, iron, ironstone, stone, timber, and other goods and things (except lime and limestone), upon any part of the canal (except the first 10 miles from Birmingham), 2s. 6d. per ton. On lime and limestone upon any part of the canal, (except the first ten miles from Birmingham), 10d. per ton. On coal, iron, ironstone, stone, timber, and other goods or things, (except lime and limestone), upon the first 10 miles from the head of the canal at Birmingham, 3d. per ton per mile. On lime and limestone upon the first 10 miles from the head of the canal at Birmingham, 1d. per ton per mile.

Only 1*d.* per ton to be taken on goods or other things carried to or from the Severn, into or out of the bason near the City of Worcester, and not passing on any other part of the canal.

Paving stones, gravel, sand, and other materials for making and repairing roads; and dung, soil, marl, and other manure for the improvement of the lands or grounds of persons whose lands shall have been taken for the use of the canal, except lime and limestone, are to pass free, with the usual exceptions.

Several very extensive warehouses have been erected at Lowesmoor and Diglis, for the housing of goods; likewise a powerful steam engine for supplying the canal from the Severn. A large iron foundry has been established on the bank of the canal, under the firm of the Worcester Iron Foundry; and on the the other side, near Lowesmoor, are the Works of the Worcester Gas Light Company.

Among the public buildings in this City, the Guild-Hall is most worthy of remark: it is a modern edifice situate in the High Street, and was completed in the year 1723, from a design of Mr. White, a native of Worcester, and a pupil to Sir Christopher Wren. On the front under the cornice is exhibited a Roman trophy, in which the imperial arms of England, supported by two angels, are the principal of the group; in a niche between the two centre windows is a statue of Queen Ann, and underneath is written in gold letters, ANNA REGINA. The parapet is ornamented with five statues, (viz.) on the centre is the figure of Justice with her sword and balance; on the right, Peace, with the olive branch; and on the left, Plenty, with the cornucopia. The statue at the North end represents Chastisement, that on the South, Hercules or Labour. In niches on each side the entrance, are the statues of King Charles the 1st and 2d; the former supporting the church, the latter holding legal government.

The hall on the first floor is spacious and lofty: to

the West are two courts of justice, wherein are held the assizes and sessions for the County and City: Over the hall is the council chamber, a most elegant apartment; in the centre opposite to the entrance is placed on a bracket of statuary marble, richly embellished, a portrait of his present Majesty in his coronation robes, presented by him to the Corporation, (at their request) when on a visit to this City in the year 1788. Adjoining the council chamber are handsome rooms for tea and cards at the public assemblies; likewise two commodious rooms for the County and City grand juries.

Opposite to the Town Hall is the new Market Place, its interior is well arranged, and was first opened on the 18th of February 1804: its erection cost the Corporation the sum of £5050. The Market days are Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays; the latter is the principal market day for all kinds of commodities.

The Theatre, a commodious building now under the management of Mr. CRISP, is situated in Angel Street. It was erected by the subscription of twenty persons £50 each, advanced on security of the building, each subscriber to receive interest for his money, and a silver ticket, transferable at pleasure. Plays during the season are exhibited four times a week.

The public subscription Library, situated the North West side of Angel Street, is an institution under the direction of a President, Treasurer, and a Committee, annually chosen; the subscribers are numerous, and the terms of subscription moderate. Strangers and non-residents are admitted on being introduced by a subscriber.

The general Infirmary, a very handsome building, pleasantly situated to the West of the Foregate Street, and commands a most delightful prospect; the interior is airy and spacious. The building was erected in the year 1770, by voluntary contributions, at the expence of £6085, and is ably supported by

legacies and the liberality of the public. The yearly receipts are about £4000, it being a general Infirmary it is open to patients of all countries, by a recommendation from a subscriber. In cases of accident persons are admitted without a recommendation, any hour during the day or night. The late Mr. ROBERT VELLERS, formerly a silk mercer in this City, bequeathed to his executors for the benefit of this institution, the sum of £6000. It is attended by three physicians, three surgeons, and other officers; (viz.) Drs. Woodyatt, Malden, and Hastings; Messrs. Carden, Sandford, and Shepherd, Surgeons; House Surgeon, Mr. Hubert Cole; inspecting apothecary Mr. John Raymont; Matron Mrs. Perkes.

The House of Industry is a noble edifice built on an eminence called Tallow Hill, to the East of the City, it was erected by virtue of an Act of Parliament, in the 32d year of the reign of his present Majesty, under the direction of G. Byfield, Esq. at an expence of £7318 7s. exclusive of the sum of £2273 3s. 3d. in purchase of about 22 acres of land adjoining. On the 10th of November, 1794, the poor of the incorporated parishes of Worcester were first received into this comfortable asylum. Under the provisions of the Act of Parliament Justices of the peace may act in the united capacities of Magistrate and Director of this institution.

The City Gaol, situate in Friar Street, was formerly a house of grey friars; it is the most entire of any ancient religious house in Worcester; it was granted to the Citizens by Henry the 8th.

The new County Prison, erected at an expence of near £19,000, is situated in Salt Lane, leading from the Foregate Street into Pitchcroft, just without the boundaries of the City; it is surrounded by a brick wall 15 feet high, which encloses about three acres of ground, the different wards are well arranged for the various classes of criminals, and separate ones are appropriated for the male and female debtors. Mr.

DAVIS, the present keeper, has been in that office upwards of 30 years.

The following public schools and hospitals have been founded and endowed in this City and neighbourhood ;—

The King's, a college school founded by King Henry the 8th, 1541, for 40 scholars.

Queen Elizabeth's school, endowed for the classical education of 12 boys, situate near St. Swithin's church, founded in the 3d year of her reign. Rebuilt 1735.

Bishop Lloyd's school, in New Street, endowed for 16 boys and 8 girls, founded in the year 1714.

Subscription free school, upon the Lancasterian system. Erected 1810.

National school on the Madras system. Established 1812.

Moore's hospital, Silver Street, endowed for the relief and education of 10 poor children.

Inglethorp's hospital, adjoining Sansom Fields, endowed for 6 men and 2 women. The number has since been augmented.

Nash's hospital, New Street, endowed for 10 men and 2 women ; 5 more has since been added.

Wyatt's hospital, Friar Street, endowed for 6 poor men.

Queen Elizabeth's hospital endowed for 29 poor women.

Burkley's hospital, opposite the Hop Market, endowed for 12 poor men.

Shewring's hospital, Tything, endowed for 6 poor women.

St. Oswald's hospital, Tything, endowed 1682, in which are supported 16 men and 12 women.

Goulding's hospital, Tything, endowed for 3 men and 3 women.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

Borough of Droitwich.



DROITWICH, an ancient Borough, seven miles from *Worcester* and 118 from *London*, is governed by two Bailiffs, two Justices, Recorder, &c. and sends two Members to Parliament.

This Borough had privileges and immunities granted by King John, and in the reign of King James the First, the Bailiffs and Burgesses were elected a Body Corporate. By this charter, two Bailiffs are elected annually. Formerly they tried their felons for capital offences, but now only for petty ones. By the court, which is held every Thursday, debts to the amount of £9 19s. may be recovered.

The Salt Works have frequently engaged the attention of the curious. The brine is considered to exceed all other in purity, is entirely free from bittern, and from that light calcereous earth, called scratch, which abounds in most salt springs, and is, perhaps, one of the richest sources of sea salt in the world.

The general process of making salt is by filling a pan with brine (which rises in pits as fresh water), conveyed into it by pumps, when a piece of resin, the size of a pea, is thrown into it to make it graduate *fac*. When the brine is boiling, the salt first incrusts

at the top, and then subsides to the bottom. After it is subsided, the Wallers, or persons employed in the seals, lade it out with an iron skimmer, and put it into wicker barrows. each containing one bushel, in the form of a sugar loaf, and let them stand at the side of the pan about three hours to drain. They then drop the salt out of the barrow, and place it in the stove to harden; afterwards it is fit for use. To make a ton of salt, there is generally used from 15 to 16 cwt. of coals.

The market-house, which is situated in the High-street, near St. Andrew's Church, was built in the year 1628. The weekly market is held on Friday. Here are two fairs annually, viz.—June 19th and December 20th.

The navigation to Droitwich was begun in 1768, and the first load of coal brought by water was in 1771.

BROMSGROVE.

A

BRIDF ACCOUNT

OF THE

Town of Bromsgrove.



BROMSGROVE, situated 13 miles from *Worcester*, 13 from *Birmingham*, and 114 from *London*, contains one long street, in which are a considerable number of well-built houses, and several good inns. The population is about 3000, and the local jurisdiction consists of a Court Baron, which sits once in three weeks, in the Town Hall, for the recovery of small debts. As early as the reign of Edward the 1st, this town sent Members to Parliament, but now that is discontinued. The church, which stands upon a hill ascended by nearly seventy steps, is a handsome Gothic structure, dedicated to St. John the Baptist. The tower and spire, whose height is 189 feet, form a most commanding object, and is equal in antique elegance to any in the county; on the western side are the statues of St. John, St. Peter, and St. Paul.

The market, which is held here every TUESDAY, is well supplied with provisions. There are two fairs annually, viz.—June 24th, and October 2d; also, a market toll-free for cattle the last Tuesday in March, April, May, and August.

There are several places of worship in Bromsgrove appropriated to dissenters. Likewise an excellent

free grammar school, founded by Edward the 6th, with an additional endowment by Sir THOMAS COOKES, who gave exhibitions from the school to Worcester College, Oxford, of his own foundation.

A very extensive Worsted Manufactory is carried on here, by Messrs. ADAMS & Co. ; but the principal manufacture consists in sheeting, table cloths, and coarse linen ; likewise in needles, nails, and other small articles in the iron trade, which gives employment to nearly one half of the population.

Bromsgrove lickey, a little to the north of the town, is a wild and lofty range of hills. The views from it over the surrounding country are very extensive and pleasing. It contains a small spring, which divides itself into two streams, one of which flowing to the northward, runs into the Rea, and after joining the Trent, falls into the German ocean ; whilst the other, emptying itself into the Stour, and thence to the Severn, is carried into the Irish sea. This great waste, containing 2000 acres, which formerly yielded nothing but heath, furze, and fern, is now in a great measure enclosed, and produces good crops of turnips, clover, and potatoes.

STOURBRIDGE.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

Town of Stourbridge.



STOURBRIDGE is a township in the parish of Oldswinford, situated at the north-west extremity of the great midland mining and manufacturing district, on the south bank of the Stour, which serves as a boundary line of the counties of *Worcester* and *Stafford*. Its appellation was derived from a bridge erected over the river Stour in the reign of Henry the seventh, previous to which time the township was known by the name of Bedcote, which is still the designation of a contiguous manor. The same monarch granted to this town a court leet, a market on Fridays, and two fairs annually; on the 29th of March and the 8th of September; for some days previous to the former is held a large mart for horses.

The vicinity of Stourbridge abounds with valuable mines of coal, iron-stone, and clay of a peculiar quality, calculated for bricks, crucibles, and other vessels destined to bear a considerable degree of heat without fusion, which is exported to all parts of the kingdom.

The manufacture of glass was established here in 1557, about the time of its introduction into this kingdom from Lorraine, and has contributed much to the present situation of the town. The number of houses in this branch, at the present time, amount to twelve.

Iron works of great magnitude have been erected in the neighbourhood, and numerous manufactories in this branch, as nails, implements of husbandry, &c. &c. are of long standing, and afford employment to some thousands of the industrious poor for many miles round.

The Stourbridge canal, which communicates to the Staffordshire, commences at the wharf close to the town, by which a communication is opened with all parts of the kingdom.

The church, which is dedicated to St. Thomas, stands on the western skirts of the town; it is a neat edifice of brick ornamented with stone, and was erected in A. D. 1735. There are also several meeting houses for various classes of dissenters, who form a very respectable part of the population, which, according to the census in 1811, amounted to 4072, and that of the whole parish 9755, but is now considerably increased.

A free grammar school, founded here by Edward the sixth, is handsomely endowed, to which a library has been added by a subsequent donation; two respectable houses are attached to the school for the residence of the masters, (the Rev. JOSEPH TAYLOR,* and the Rev. J. C. HOMFRAY,) whose salaries are liberal, *but there are no scholars!* There are likewise several charity and sunday schools, which are supported with great liberality. A school on the Madras system was also instituted in 1815.

In the adjoining hamlet of Oldswinford is a noble hospital founded by the late THOMAS FOLEY, Esq. for boarding, clothing, and educating sixty boys, and is now ably superintended by Mr. JAMES FISHER, steward and head master, and is under similar regulations to that of Christ Church, London; many of the leases on the estate bequeathed to this school have lately expired, in consequence of which the receipts are considerably increased, and ten more boys are added to the number. *At this school* the intention of the donor is strictly acted upon.

Stourbridge is distant from *London* 121 miles, from *Worcester* 23, *Birmingham* 13, and *Bridgnorth* 14, and may now be considered a place of present wealth and increasing opulence.

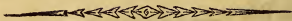

ALL double, treble, and other letters whatever, pay in proportion to the respective rates of single letters; but no letter or packet to and from places within the kingdom of Great Britain, together with the contents thereof, shall be charged more than as a treble letter, unless the same shall weigh an ounce when it shall be rated as four single letters, and so in proportion for every quarter of an ounce above that weight, reckoning each quarter of an ounce as a single letter.

The safe conveyance of any sum of money not exceeding 5 guineas is guaranteed to any part of the kingdom by the respective deputy Postmasters, on the payment of eight pence in the pound, and an order given, payable at sight on the deputy Postmaster where the remittance is required to be made, either in England, Scotland, or Ireland.

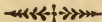

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

TOWN OF DUDLEY.



DUDLEY, a market town, situate 28 miles from Worcester, and 130 from London, containing nearly 15000 inhabitants. It has two Churches, one dedicated to Saint Thomas, and the other to Saint James; the latter has lately been rebuilt at a very great expense. This town stands in a detached part of the county, entirely surrounded by Staffordshire, and the neighbourhood abounds with mines of coal, principally the property of Lord Dudley and Ward. Here are several manufactories of crown glass, but the staple trade of the Town is iron and nails, in which a considerable property has been realized. The Castle which stands on the confines of Staffordshire is supposed to have been built by Dodo or Duddo a saxon prince, from whom some derive the name of the place; this building was once very extensive, occupying nearly an acre of ground, and though begun in the eighth century, consists now of dilapidated fragments of different styles of architecture; among

which the keep stands pre-eminent owing to its great original strength: in the civil wars it was besieged for three weeks by the parliamentary forces, but was relieved by a detachment from Worcester, it appears never to have been repaired after the damage it then sustained.

Here are several places of worship, appropriated to dissenters of various denominations; likewise 3 charity schools, one of which was founded by Mr. Richard Foley, of Stourbridge, for 50 boys, of which the pious Baxter was the first master. The others are a free school for the education of 50 girls, and a free grammar school: and there are no less than 7 sunday schools

The market is on Saturday, and the fairs May 8th, for cattle, wool, and cheese, Aug. 5th, for sheep and cattle, and October 2nd, for horses cattle, wool, and sheep.

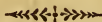

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

Town of Kidderminster.

KIDDERMINSTER, a Market Town and Borough in Halfshire Hundred, 14 miles from Worcester, and 126 from London, on the river Stour, containing 1636 houses, and 7036 inhabitants, viz 3987 males, and 1049 females; of whom 3658 were returned as employed in various trades and manufactures, and 345 in agriculture. This return was made in the year 1811, but the population is now considerably increased.

The Church is a venerable Gothic structure, very large, and has of late been ornamented and repaired at a considerable expence; in it are many curious ancient monuments. The tower, adjoining the church, is a strong lofty pile, containing eight bells. The Town Hall is a large commodious brick building, being in part occupied by several tenements, and part for the prison. On the ground floor there are butcher's stalls, above is the council chamber for transacting public business. The

streets are well paved, and kept very clean, and the town has lately been lighted with gas. Here are twelve alms houses, and besides sunday schools, eight charity schools for boys and girls.

Kidderminster was noted for its manufactures in the reign of Henry the 8th; for broad cloths, afterwards for wolseys, and at a subsequent period for bombazeens, crapes, and poplins. The Scotch and flat carpet manufacture, known by the name of Kidderminsters was introduced here about 1735. Some years since the cut carpet was wrought here with great skill, and in 1772, the number of looms in the town and neighbourhood amounted to upwards of 250. This manufacture gives employment to more than half the population, a considerable number of whom are employed in preparing the yarn for the manufactures. A silk manufactory was erected here in 1755, and one in imitation of the Marseilles quilting.

The Lord of the manor holds a court leet for the prevention of encroachments and public nuisances; and here is a court of requests for the recovery of small debts. No county magistrate has a right to exercise any judicial authority in this borough, which is governed by a recorder and two magistrates, called the bailiff and justices; the bailiff, who is one of the quorum, is annually elected by his brother aldermen, twelve in number, with the concurrence of the twenty-five common council mem. It formerly sent members to parliament. Here is a good grammar school at the east end of the church choir, free for all the inhabitants of the town, endowed with lands and tene-

ments producing upwards of £150. per annum for two Masters. The Staffordshire and Worcester Canal which passes this place opens a communication to Hull, Liverpool, Manchester Bristol, &c. and other trading towns. It crosses the river Stour about 100 yards from the market place, at the foot of the eminence on which the church is erected and where there is a very commodious wharf and warehouses Market on Thursday for all kinds of grain provisions, &c Fares Monday in the week before Easter, Holy Thursday, June 20th and 4th of September, for all kinds of Merchandise

The living is a vicarage, rated at £30 16s. 7d. with Mitton Chapel annexed, the clear annual value being rather more than £500 per annum.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

TOWN OF STOURPORT.



STOURPORT, a market Town, situated upon the east bank of the Severn. A few years since this town was almost a barren sandy heath, till the junction of the Staffordshire Canal with the Severn was formed at this place, which from an insignificant village, is now become a neat and handsome town. New buildings are continually springing up, and its wharfs, extensive basons, and busy traffic, present a lively picture of a little seaport.

By means of the Canal from this place there is an easy communication with most parts of the north, Manchester, Liverpool, &c. The Manufacturers of Birmingham and the adjacent towns derive great advantage from having their heaviest products conveyed by water to the principal seaports in the kingdom, without any material addition to their original price. The first bason was opened in 1771, after an expence of £105,000.

A considerable trade is carried on here in coals, corn, hops and fruit. The houses in general are well built and the population upwards of 2000. Market on Wednesday for all kinds of provisions. Fairs, March 27, September 14, and December 18.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

TOWN OF BEWDLEY.

BEWDLLEY, a Borough and Market town, in the parish of Ribbesford, situated on the river Severn, 3 miles from Kidderminster, and 132 from London. In 1811 it contained 787 houses, and 3671 inhabitants, of whom 939 were returned as employed in trade and manufacture. The new chapel which is a neat edifice is in the centre of the town, built in 1748; at a small distance from which, stood the Old Shambles, or the Walk, being a long range of timber buildings open on both sides, and were removed in 1783.

In 1795 an Act of Parliament was obtained for building a new bridge over the Severn, which leads directly down from the main street; the bridge is a very light and elegant stone structure, consisting of three arches with a toll house at the east end. Henry the 7th built a palace here for his son Arthur, at which the ceremony of his marriage with the infant of Spain by her proxy, was performed on Whitsunday, 1499; his corpse also rested here

on its way from Ludlow to Worcester, the place of its interment. In the town are several dissenting meeting houses, and a free grammar school founded by James the 1st. It formerly sent two members to parliament, but now only one. The town enjoys a good trade in malt, leather, horn, and Dutch and sailors caps, which are much prized for their excellent napping, a considerable number of which are sent to London and other places for exportation. The corporation consists of a Bailiff, with 12 Aldermen and Burgesses. At Blackstone, a beautiful rock on the edge of the Severn, is an hermitage very curiously excavated in the rock, with a chapel and several apartments. The market is on Saturday, which is well supplied with cattle, corn, hops, &c. Fairs, April 23, July 25, and December 10.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

TOWN OF TENBURY.

TENBURY, a market Town, 22 miles from Worcester, 9 from Leominster, and 134 from London. It is situated on the bank of the river Team, which divides it from Salop. According to the last census in 1811, it contained 185 houses and 905 inhabitants, exclusive of the Hamlet called the Foreign, containing 44 houses and 233 inhabitants. On the north side of the town is a neat stone Bridge consisting of six arches over the river Team, which divides the counties of Worcester and Salop. The river here is very subject to flood, as on the south side of the town a small brook called Kyre empties itself into the Team, and is often blocked up by it. The great flood, November 17th, 1770, threw down the south and middle aisles of the church, by which means the windows, organ, &c. were broken, and the monuments much injured. Here are annual horse races, respectably attended. The market is on Tuesday, and its fairs are 25th of April, 18th of July, and 26th of September.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

BOROUGH OF EVESHAM.

EEVESHAM, a Borough and Market Town, comprising three parishes, including Bengeworth; containing 606 houses, and 2837 inhabitants, being 1332 males, and 1505 females, of whom 472 were returned as employed in trade. It is pleasantly situated on rising ground, having a charming view of the winding river Avon, over which it has a stone bridge of seven arches and a convenient harbour for barges. The well known Vale of Evesham, extending along its banks is remarkable for its fertility in corn as well as pasturage. This town had formerly a stately Monastery, whose Abbot sat in Parliament as a spiritual lord. It was founded in 709, by Prince Egwin, who retired hither after having been unjustly dispossessed of the bishoprick of Worcester by the Pope. The principal fragment of this building now remaining, is a large pointed arch or gateway 17 feet high. The borough has three parish churches, two in that part called Evesham, and one at Bengeworth at the foot of the bridge where

was formerly a castle. It is remarkable that although each of the churches have towers, the bells hang in a very handsome tower, separate from any other building, about 110 feet high. In the Town are a well endowed Free Grammar School, a Charity School, and Almshouses. A number of market gardens hereabouts supply the markets of Tewkesbury, Cheltenham, Worcester, and Birmingham, and in Asparagus season they supply Bath and Bristol.

Evesham is a Borough by prescription, governed by a Mayor, Recorder, seven Aldermen, twelve Common-council men, and twenty-four Assistants. Their privileges are very extensive; the Mayor and four of the Aldermen are justices of the peace, hold sessions of Oyer and Terminer, and gaol delivery, with power to punish all crimes except high treason, within their liberty. One of the most remarkable battles in the English annals was fought here in 1265, between Somon de Montford the great earl of Leicester, and prince Edward, afterwards king Edward the 1st. in which the earl and most of his adherents were slain. The market is on Mondays, and the fairs on the 2nd of February, the first Monday after Easter, Whitmonday, and September 21st.

BRIEF ACCOUNT

OF THE

TOWN OF PERSHORE.

PERSHORE, a market town, consisting of two Parishes, Saint Andrews and Holy Cross, 9 miles from Worcester, $9\frac{1}{2}$ from Tewkesbury, and 103 from London, near the junction of the river Avon with the Bow, containing about 400 houses and 2000 inhabitants; the main street is near three quarters of a mile long and a considerable sum of money has been collected for paving the footway with flag stones, which will be a considerable improvement to the town. The parish is of great extent, having several manors and chapelries within its limits. In the reign of Edward the 1st. this town sent 2 members of parliament, but never since. The church of Holy Cross contains several ancient monuments, it has a square tower with 8 bells, and is a curacy to St. Andrews, which is small and has a square tower with 6 bells. Here was formerly an extensive abbey of Benedictine Monks. The Market is on Tuesday, and the Fairs Easter Tuesday, June 26th, first Monday in August and the Tuesday before the 1st of November. The great Fair has usually been held in the church-yard, but we understand the Magistracy are determined to prevent a recurrence of a practice so disgraceful.

The Church is an extremely neat building, erected in 1758 and has a square tower containing 5 bells. The town carries on a considerable traffic by barges on the Severn, over which it has a stone bridge of 6 arches. The Market is on Thursday. Fairs, first Thursday after Midlent, Thursday in Whitsun week and before St. Matthews day, and on the 2nd. of September.

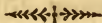

SHIPSTON-UPON-STOUR.

SHIPSTON-UPON-STOUR, a Market Town, in a detached part of the county, surrounded by Warwickshire, 5 miles from Moreton, and 83 from London, containing 270 houses and 1293 inhabitants. Its name is derived from its situation on the river Stour, and its being noted formerly as one of the greatest sheep markets in the kingdom. The town has no trade of any consequence, but has a tolerable good market on Fridays, and two fairs annually, viz. on the 22nd of June and the Tuesday after the 10th of October. It is a Vicarage with *Tidmington* annexed, and the Patrons are the Dean and Chapter of Worcester, and Jesus College, Oxford, by turns.

ABBERLEY, 11 miles from Worcester, and 8 from Bewdley, near the Kingston Canal, containing 82 houses, and 495 inhabitants. The neighbourhood is greatly benefited by having coal-pits, from which the adjoining country is supplied.

ABBERTON, 6 miles from Alcester, containing 15 houses, and 86 inhabitants, is remarkable for having a spring of mineral water which contains steel mixed with salt, said to be equal in virtue to those at Epsom, in Surry

ABBOT'S MORTON, 4 miles from Evesham, containing 40 houses, and 191 inhabitants.

ACTON BEAUCHAMP, 4 miles from Bromyard, containing 42 houses, and 214 inhabitants.

ALDERMINSTER, 6 miles from Shipston-upon-Stour, containing 76 houses, and 363 inhabitants.

ALVECHURCH, 5 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 207 houses, and 1228 inhabitants. The parish is 7 miles in circuit, and was formerly a market town. The church is an ancient building, containing vestiges of Saxon architecture. Here is a good free grammar school, and an alms-house, founded by Nicholas Lewkner, of Hadzor.

ARELEY KINGS, 4 miles from Bewdley, containing 75 houses, and 377 inhabitants.

ASHLEY, 6 miles from Bewdley, containing 117 houses, and 697 inhabitants.

BADSEY, 2 miles from Evesham, containing 42 houses, and 284 inhabitants.

BAYTON, 6 miles from Bewdley, containing 77 houses, and 389 inhabitants.

BELLBROUGHTON, 4 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 249 houses, and 1266 inhabitants. A considerable number of nails are manufactured here. There are 2 fairs, viz. on the 25th of April, and the 17th of October.

BENGEWORTH, adjoining Evesham, containing 147 houses, and 672 inhabitants. *See brief account of Evesham, page 295.*

BEOLEY, 7 miles from Bromsgrove, on the boundaries of Warwickshire, containing 126 houses, and 630 inhabitants.

BERROW, 5 miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 71 houses, and 397 inhabitants.

BEWDLEY, see page 277

BIRLINGHAM, 3 miles from Pershore, containing 70 houses, and 353 inhabitants.

BIRTSMORTON, 4 miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 45 houses, and 238 inhabitants.

BISHAPMTON, 7 miles from Evesham, containing 61 houses, and 308 inhabitants.

BLOCKLEY, detached from this county, and surrounded by Gloucestershire, contains 326 houses, and 1569 inhabitants. *Paxford, Aston, Draycot, Ditchford,* and *Dorn*, are hamlets to this parish. A brook, which rises in Bourton wood, flows in a serpentine course through the parish, and has several silk and corn mills thereon; the silk manufacture employs a number of hands, and meets with considerable success.

BOCKLETON, 6 miles from Tenbury, containing 42 houses, and 223 inhabitants.

BRADFORTON, 3 miles from Evesham, containing 81 houses, and 413 inhabitants. The hamlet of *Aldington* is in this parish.

BREDICOT, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Worcester, containing 7 houses, and 32 inhabitants.

BREDON, near Pershore, containing 129 houses, and 749 inhabitants. The situation is pleasant and healthy; Bredon hill has one of the finest prospectives in the county, on the top is a lofty summer-house, from which may be viewed the cities of Worcester and Gloucester, Cheltenham, &c. The living is a rectory, the most valuable in the diocese of Worcester, and has the chapelries of *Norton, Mitton,* and *Cutsdean* annexed, with three hamlets *Westmancot, Kelmesham,* and *Hardewick*.

BROADWAS, $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Worcester, containing 41 houses, and 245 inhabitants. It is situated on the river Team; the church is ornamented with some curious painted glass.

BROADWAY, 5 miles from Evesham, containing 249 houses, and 1117 inhabitants. It consists of one large street, the houses whereof are chiefly built of free-stone, and has a neat church. The hills at the end of the town are famous for

their romantic prospects, on which are several gentlemen's seats

BROMSGROVE, a parish of large extent, containing near 1200 houses, and 7000 inhabitants. *King's Norton* Chapel is annexed. See town of Bromsgrove, page 137.

BROUGHTON HACKET, 4 miles from Worcester, containing 14 houses, and 65 inhabitants.

BUSHLEY, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Tewkesbury, containing 57 houses, and 262 inhabitants.

CASTLE MORTON, 4 miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 124 houses, and 659 inhabitants

CHADDESLEY CORBETT, 5 miles from Kidderminster, containing 223 houses, and 1249 inhabitants.

CHURCH HONEYBOURNE, 4 miles from Evesham, containing 11 houses, and 121 inhabitants.

CHURCHILL, 3 miles from Kidderminster, containing 19 houses, and 121 inhabitants.

CHURCHILL, 4 miles from Worcester, containing 16 houses, and 98 inhabitants.

CHURCH LENCH, 5 miles from Evesham, containing 34 houses, and 150 inhabitants. *Ash Lench*, *Atch Lench*, and *Sheriff Lench*, are hamlets to this parish.

CLAINES, 3 miles from Worcester, containing 314 houses, and 1463 inhabitants. It formerly was only a chapelry to St Helens, Worcester, but is now a distinct curacy.

CLEEVE PRIOR, see Priors Cleve.

CLIFTON-ON-TEME, 10 miles from Worcester, containing 84 houses, and 499 inhabitants. It is a pleasant and diversified part of the county,

and was formerly a market town. *Sapey Pritchard* is a hamlet to this parish.

COMBERTON GREAT, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Pershore, on the river Avon, containing 45 houses, and 218 inhabitants. In this parish is the hamlet of *Comberton Little*

COTHERIDGE, 4 miles from Worcester, containing 40 houses, and 254 inhabitants.

CROOME D'ABITOT $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Worcester, containing 15 houses, and 118 inhabitants.

CROOME EARLS, near the above, containing 32 houses, and 158 inhabitants.

CROOME HILL, adjoining, containing 34 houses, and 169 inhabitants.

CROPTHORN, 3 miles from Evesham, containing 43 houses, and 240 inhabitants. The manors of *Charlton* and *Netherton*, are in this parish.

CROWLE, 5 miles from Worcester, containing 60 houses, and 346 inhabitants.

DODDERHILL, adjoining the borough of Droitwich, containing 130 houses, and 677 inhabitants.

DORMSTON, 7 miles from Droitwich, containing 13 houses, and 85 inhabitants.

DOVERDALE, 3 miles from Droitwich, containing 6 houses, and 60 inhabitants.

DROITWICH, see page 125.

DUDLEY, see page 207.

EASTHAM, near Tenbury, containing 70 houses, and 385 inhabitants. The hamlets of *Hanley Child*, *Hanley William*, and *Orlton*, are in this parish.

ECKINGTON, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Pershore, containing 96 houses, and 550 inhabitants.

ELDERSFIELD, 6 miles from Tewkesbury, containing 136 houses, and 750 inhabitants.

ELMLEY CASTLE, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Pershore, on the Breendon Hills, containing 56 houses, and 296 inhabitants. The hamlet of *Netherton* is in this parish.

ELMLEY LOVETT, 4 miles from Kidderminster, containing 71 houses, and 369 inhabitants.

EVENLOAD, on the borders of Gloucestershire, near Stow on the Wold, containing 48 houses and 227 inhabitants.

EVESHAM, see page 295.

FECKENHAM, 7 miles from Droitwich, containing 346 houses, and 1830 inhabitants. The church is a neat building, and the parish has a good charity school; here are several needle manufactories, and it has 2 fairs, 27th of March and 30th of September.

FLADBURY, 4 miles from Evesham, containing 72 houses, and 424 inhabitants. It has 4 chapelries, viz. *Wyre Piddle*, *Bradley*, *Throckmorton*, and *Hob Lench*, with the hamlets of *Hill* and *Moore*.

FLYFORD FLAVELL, 7 miles from Worcester, containing 25 houses, and 117 inhabitants.

GRAFTON FLYFORD, 6 miles from Droitwich, containing 42 houses, and 184 inhabitants.

GRIMLEY, 5 miles from Worcester, is a large parish, containing 98 houses, and 543 inhabitants. It has many hop plantations, and fruit trees in abundance. The chapelry of *Hallow* is annexed. In *Hallow Park* is a spring similar in virtue to those at *Cheltenham*.

HADZOR, 1 mile from Droitwich, containing 11 houses, and 90 inhabitants.

HAGLEY, 2 miles from Stourbridge, containing 104 houses, and 621 inhabitants. The chancel of the church was rebuilt in 1754, and the floor paved with marble at the expense of the late Lord Lyttelton.

HAMPTON LOVET, 3 miles from Droitwich, containing 34 houses and 198 inhabitants.

HAMPTON GREAT, 1 mile from Evesham, containing 58 houses, and 276 inhabitants.—*Hampton Little* is a hamlet to this parish.

HANBURY, 3 miles from Droitwich, containing 165 houses, and 983 inhabitants.

HANLEY CASTLE, 2 miles from Upton, containing 176 houses, and 986 inhabitants. There are several gentlemen's seats in this parish.

HARTLEBURY, an extensive parish, containing 281 houses, and 1534 inhabitants. Hartlebury Castle is the residence of the Bishop of Worcester.

HARVINGTON, 6 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 52 houses, and 262 inhabitants.

HIMBLETON, 4 miles from Droitwich, contains 60 houses, and 289 inhabitants. The hamlet of *Stock* is in this parish.

HINLIP, 3 miles from Worcester, containing 23 houses, and 149 inhabitants.

HOLT, 5 miles from Worcester, containing 56 houses, and 327 inhabitants. The church is one of the most complete remains of saxon architecture at this time extant, to which *Whitley* chapel is annexed.

ICCOMB, 2 miles from Stow in the Wold, containing 24 houses and 112 inhabitants.

INKBERROW, 4 miles from Alcester, con-

taining 289 houses, and 1335 inhabitants. It has two hamlets, viz. *Morton-Underhill* and *Cokehill*.

KEMPSEY, 3 miles from Worcester, on the Bath road containing 166 houses, and 845 inhabitants. It has the Chapelry *Norton* and the hamlet of *Stoulton*

KIDDERMINSTER, see page 247

KINGS-NORTON, 4 miles from Birmingham, this parish is near 34 miles in circuit and contains 524 houses, and 2807 inhabitants. It has a chapel of ease, and a good charity school. There are 2 Fairs, 25th of April, and 5th of September.

KINGTON, 3 miles from Droitwich, containing 26 houses, and 110 inhabitants.

KNIGHTWICK, 8 miles from Worcester, containing 25 houses, and 158 inhabitants. *Doddenham* and *Alton* are hamlets to this parish.

KYRE WYRE, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Tenbury, containing 30 houses, and 165 inhabitants. The hamlet of *Kyre Minor* adjoins this parish, and is noted for the quantity of Wild Saffron growing therein.

LEIGH, 7 miles from Worcester, is a large parish, having rich meadows adjoining the Team, it contains 223 houses, and 1255 inhabitants. *Leigh Sinton*, *Leigh Braces*, *Bransford*, and *Chornel*, are in this parish.

LINDRIDGE, 5 miles from Tenbury, containing 99 houses, and 543 inhabitants. The hamlets of *Knighton* and *Pensax* are in this parish.

LITTLETON SOUTH, 3 miles from Evesham, containing 30 houses, and 116 inhabitants.

LITTLETON MIDDLE, a parish united with the above, containing 40 houses, and 304 inhabitants, with the hamlet of *Littelton North* annexed.

LONGDON, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 106 houses, and 535 inhabitants. The chapelry of *Chasley* is annexed.

MADDRESFIELD, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 25 houses, and 153 inhabitants.

MALVERN GREAT, 7 miles from Worcester, containing 163 houses, and 819 inhabitants, well known for its delightful prospects, and the salubrity and pureness of the air. There are several hotels for the accommodation of visitors, it being frequented by the most polite circles in the country. The church which formerly belonged to a magnificent monastery, was purchased by the inhabitants at the dissolution, and for its beauty of antiquity is not to be equalled in this part of the country.

The admirable pile of Malvern Hills, which give name to this village is situated in Worcestershire and Herefordshire, and from the survey made by order of the Board of Ordnance some time since, it appears that the extreme height was 1444 feet above the level of the sea.

The views from them extend over 10 counties, and are beautiful beyond description; from these hills issue several springs, one called Holy Well, about half way up the summit, and about 2 miles from Great Malvern, is accounted very salutary, and has long been used in all cases where chalybeate waters are given, with considerable success. *Malvern Little* and *Newland* are hamlets to this parish.

MAMBLE, 7 miles from Bewdley, containing 56 houses, and 338 inhabitants.

MARTIN HUSSINGTREE, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from

Worcester, containing 29 houses, and 194 inhabitants.

MARTLEY, 7 miles from Worcester, containing 173 houses, and 1050 inhabitants.

MATHON, 8 miles from Worcester, containing 89 houses, and 547 inhabitants.

NAUNTON BEAUCHAMP, 3 miles from Pershore, containing 21 houses, and 115 inhabitants.

NORTHFIELD, 7 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 236 houses, and 1313 inhabitants. The hamlet of *Cofton Hacket* is in this parish.

NORTON, 3 miles from Evesham, containing 59 houses, and 306 inhabitants. To this parish is annexed the hamlet of *Lench Wick*.

ODDINGLEY, 2 miles from Droitwich, containing 22 houses, and 110 inhabitants.

OFFENHAM, 2 miles from Evesham, containing 63 houses, and 264 inhabitants.

OLDBOROUGH, or OLDBARROW, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Henley in Arden, surrounded by Warwickshire, containing 19 houses, and 113 inhabitants. There is an ancient Tumulus here, whence it is supposed to be named.

OLD SWINFORD, adjoining the town of Stourbridge, containing 705 houses, and 3766 inhabitants. Here is a noble charity for the Education of 70 boys. See Stourbridge, page 166.

OMBERSLEY, 5 miles from Worcester, containing 283 houses, and 1696 inhabitants. The parish is very extensive being nearly 12 miles in circumference and has 17 hamlets annexed to it. Here is a good charity school.

OVERBURY, 5 miles from Tewkesbury, on the south side of Bredon Hill, it has the manors of

Conderton, Tedington, Alston and Washbourn, and contains 85 houses, and 425 inhabitants.

PEDMORE, $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile from Stourbridge, containing 51 houses, and 306 inhabitants. Here is a good charity school.

PENDOCK, 4 miles from Upton, containing 48 houses, and 211 inhabitants.

PEOPLETON, 3 miles from Pershore, containing 42 houses and 214 inhabitants.

PERSHORE, see page 308

PIDDLE NORTH, 6 miles from Worcester, containing 20 houses, and 103 inhabitants.

POWICK, 2 miles from Worcester, on the Malvern Road, containing 295 houses, and 1172 inhabitants.

PRIOR'S CLEVE, near Evesham, containing 62 houses, and 287 inhabitants.

REDMARLEY D'ABITOT, near Upton-upon-Severn, containing 126 houses, and 689 inhabitants.

RIBBESFORD, 1 mile from Bewdley, containing 14 houses, and 88 inhabitants.

RIPPLE, near Upton-upon-Severn, supposed to be a place of some note formerly, having many remains of antiquity. It contains 130 houses, and 679 inhabitants. *Queenhill and Holdfast* are chapelries to Ripple.

ROCK, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Bewdley, containing 62 houses, and 532 inhabitants. *Heightington* is a township to this parish, and contains 148 houses, and 862 inhabitants, including *Alton*.

ROUSLENCH, 6 miles from Alcester, containing 44 houses, and 231 inhabitants.

RUSHOCK, 4 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 30 houses, and 174 inhabitants.

SALWARP, 3 miles from Droitwich, near a river of the same name, which falls into the Severn, it contains 55 houses, and 348 inhabitants.

SEDGEBERROW, 4 miles from Evesham, containing 36 houses, and 184 inhabitants.

SEVERN STOKE, see Stoke Severn.

SHELSLEY BEAUCHAMP, 10 miles from Worcester, containing 36 houses, and 263 inhabitants.

SHELSEY KINGS, united with the above, containing 38 houses, and 238 inhabitants.

SHELSLEY WALSH, a third Parish on the opposite side of the Team, containing 32 houses, and 167 inhabitants.

SHRAWLEY, $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Worcester, containing 81 houses, and 504 inhabitants.

SPETCHLEY, 3 miles from Worcester, containing 19 houses, and 127 inhabitants.

STANFORD, 11 miles from Worcester, on the borders of Herefordshire, and banks of the Team, containing 23 houses, and 140 inhabitants. The church is an elegant Gothic structure of stone, situated on an eminence.

STANTON, 9 miles from Tewkesbury, on the borders of Herefordshire and Gloucestershire, though situate in the County of Worcester, it contains 52 houses, and 300 inhabitants.

STOCKTON, 13 miles from Worcester, containing 28 houses, and 108 inhabitants.

STOKE PRIOR, 2 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 135 houses, and 754 inhabitants.

STOKE SEVERN, 3 miles from Upton, containing 123 houses, and 583 inhabitants.

STONE, 2 miles from Kidderminster, containing 59 houses, and 403 inhabitants.

STRENSHAM, 5 miles from Pershore, containing 63 houses, and 286 inhabitants.

SUCKLEY, 8 miles from Worcester, containing 85 houses, and 509 inhabitants. The hamlets of *Alfrick* and *Lulsley* are in this parish.

TARDEBIG, 3 miles from Bromsgrove, containing 348 houses, and 1922 inhabitants, including *Bordesley*. The navigation from Worcester to Birmingham, runs through this parish. At *Redditch*, a chapelry to *Tardebig*, is a considerable manufacture of needles, which affords employment to upwards of 4000 persons.

TIBBERTON, 3 miles from Worcester, containing 36 houses, and 208 inhabitants.

TREADINGTON, near Shipston-upon-Stour, containing 194 houses, and 935 inhabitants.

UPTON-UPON-SEVERN, see page 317.

UPTON SNODSBURY, 6 miles from Worcester, containing 43 houses, and 216 inhabitants.

UPTON WARREN, 3 miles from Droitwich, containing 56 houses, and 342 inhabitants.

WALCOT CUMMEMBRIS, near Pershore, containing 41 houses, and 239 inhabitants.

WARNDON, 3 miles from Worcester, containing 26 houses, and 126 inhabitants.

WELLAND, 3 miles from Upton-upon-Severn, containing 64 houses, and 334 inhabitants.

WHITE LADY ASTON, 4 miles from Worcester, containing 44 houses, and 266 inhabitants.

WHITLEY GREAT, 10 miles from Worcester, containing 73 houses, and 425 inhabitants.

WICHENFORD, 5 miles from Worcester, containing 53 houses, and 375 inhabitants.

WICKHAMFORD, 2 miles from Evesham,

containing 25 houses, and 175 inhabitants.

WORCESTER, containing 9 parishes, see page 9.

YARDLEY, 4 miles from Birmingham, containing 359 houses and 1906 inhabitants. This parish is very extensive, and has the chapelry of *Marston* annexed. It has a manufactory of burnt tiles from which the town of Birmingham is chiefly supplied.

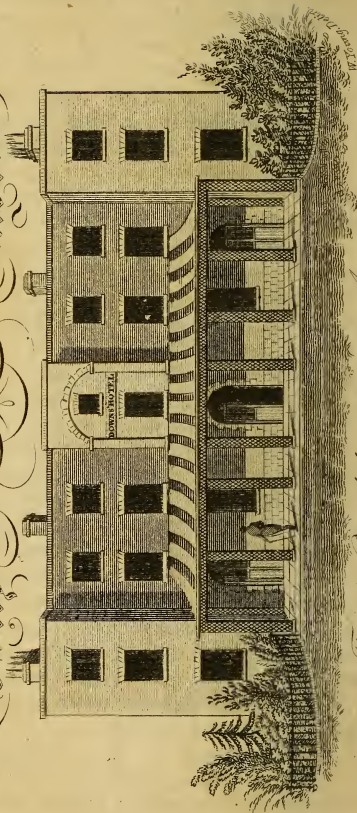

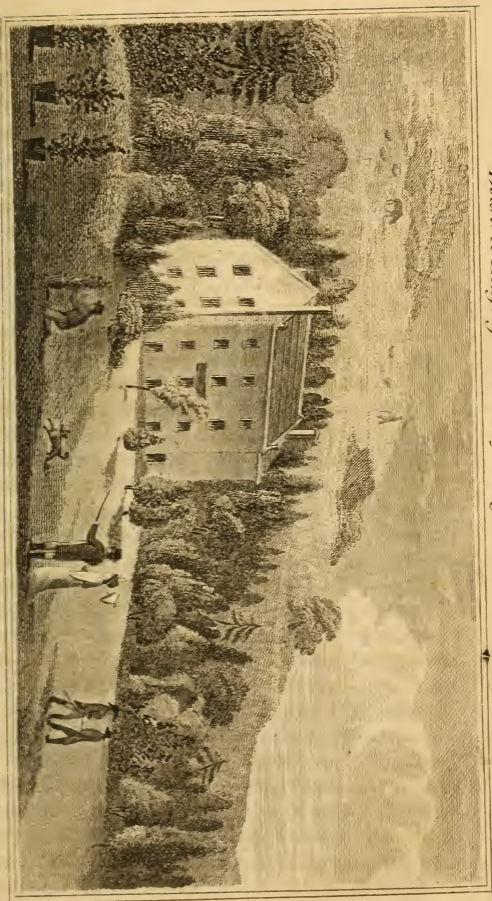
